Habitats and Species

Areas of yew and ash woodland probably of secondary origin but nevertheless fall into the lowland beech and yew woodland and lowland mixed deciduous woodland UK BAP Priority habitats respectively.

Breeding birds here, include the Red-list and UK BAP priority song thrush and marsh tit.

Designations


This site sits within the Chiltern Hills AONB.

It has been designated as Ancient Semi-Natural Woodlands (ASNW), this means they have been continuously wooded since or before 1600. In these compartments work will focus on maintaining and enhancing the health and diversity of the woodland habitat, protecting veteran trees, and management for health and safety.

A scheduled monument, 'Camp on Church Hill' overlaps with the south east edge of this wood.

Management Approaches

This area of semi-natural woodlands is in good condition with no issues and can therefore be managed with little or no intervention.
